ORDER

A telephonic status conference was held on May 8, 2019 at 11:00 a.m. (EDT). Petitioner participated via counsel, Jason Lopp, and respondent participated via counsel, Justin Guedel, staff attorney for the Department of Homeland Security. Various issues were discussed related to the course of the proceedings, resulting in the following prehearing order:

- 1. The deadline to file a motion for summary judgment is **July 22, 2019**. Motions for summary judgment and responses must be filed in accordance with Indiana Code § 4-21.5-3-23 and Indiana Trial Rule 56. If a party wishes to file a reply, it must do so within 14 days of service of the response (plus 3 days if served via US mail).
- 2. A final hearing is not scheduled at this time, as the parties have not yet decided whether to file motions for summary judgment.
- 3. The parties shall exchange witness and exhibit lists by **June 24**, **2019**. All exhibits in a party's exhibit list must be produced to the opposing party at that time. A party's witness list must include the witness's contact information and a brief description of his/her anticipated testimony. Failure to disclose a witness or exhibit by the June 24 deadline may preclude the party from relying on the witness or exhibit in support of a motion for summary judgment or at a hearing, unless good cause can be shown for why the disclosure could not have occurred sooner.

- 4. There was brief discussion regarding the involvement of the petitioner's neighbors, the Russells. The Commission's meeting minutes from February 5, 2019 indicate that the Russells appeared before the Commission and objected to petitioner's request for a variance. The parties agreed that the Russells are aware of this petition for review. Given the Russells' prior participation in the variance application, the parties had no objection to including them on future distribution lists. This does not lead to the conclusion that the Russells were entitled to notice of any prior orders as a matter of law, or that they are considered parties to this petition for review or the underlying variance application. If any person(s) intends to move to intervene in this matter, he/she should file a petition in accordance with Indiana Code § 4-21.5-3-21 as soon as practicable.
- 5. The undersigned ALJ noted that the variance application on review, Variance # 19-02-16, was not provided to the undersigned when this matter was transferred from the prior ALJ. Petitioner stated his belief that two variance applications are potentially at issue, Variance # 18-10-27 and Variance # 19-02-16. Undersigned obtained copies of both variance applications from the DHS website, which are attached to this order and made a part of the record.
- 6. A party who fails to attend or participate in a prehearing or status conference, hearing, or other stage of the proceeding may be held in default or have the proceeding dismissed pursuant to Indiana Code § 4-21.5-3-24.




FIGURE I.1(c) Underground ASME Containers. (Figure for illustrative purposes only; code shall govern.)

Annex J Sample Ordinance Adopting NFPA 58

This annex is not a part of the requirements of this NFPA document but is included for informational purposes only.

J.1 The following sample ordinance is provided to assist a jurisdiction in the adoption of this code and is not part of this code.

ORDINANCE NO.

An ordinance of the *Jjurisdiction]* adopting the 2011 edition of NFPA 58, Liquefied Petroleum Gus Code, documents listed in Chapter 2 of that code; prescribing regulations governing conditions hazardous to life and property from fire or explo-sion: providing for the issuance of permits and collection of fees; repealing Ordinance No. ____ of the [jurisdiction] and all other ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict therewith; providing a penalty; providing a severability clause; and providing for publication; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE [governing hody] OF THE [jurisdiction):

SECTION 1 That the Liquefied Petroleum Gas Code and documents adopted by Chapter 2, three (3) copies of which are on file and are open to inspection by the public in the office of the fjurisdiction's keeper of meands of the fjurisdiction, are hereby adopted and incorporated into this ordinance as fully as if set out at length herein, and from the date on which this ordinance shall take effect, the provisions thereof shall be controlling within the limits of the Jurisdiction]. The same are

hereby adopted as the code of the [jurisdiction] for the purpose of prescribing regulations governing conditions hazardous to life and property from fire or explosion and providing for issuance of permits and collection of fees.

SECTION 2 Any person who shall violate any provision of this code or standard hereby adopted or fail to comply therewith; or who shall violate or fail to comply with any order made thereunder; or who shall build in violation of any detailed statement of specifications or plans submitted and approved thereunder; or failed to operate in accordance with any certificate or permit issued thereunder; and from which no appeal has been taken; or who shall fail to comply with such an order as affirmed or modified by or by a court of competent jurisdiction, within the time fixed herein, shall severally for each and every such violation and noncompliance, respectively, be guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of not less than \$ nor more than \$____ or by imprisonment for not less _days or by both such days nor more than _ fine and imprisonment. The imposition of one penalty for any violation shall not excuse the violation or permit it to continue; and all such persons shall be required to correct or remedy such violations or defects within a reasonable time; and when not otherwise specified the application of the above penalty shall not be held to prevent the enforced removal of prohibited conditions. Each day that prohibited conditions are maintained shall constitute a separate offense.



















FIGURE 1.1(c) Underground ASME Containers. (Figure for illustrative purposes only; code shall govern.)

Annex J Sample Ordinance Adopting NFPA 58

This annex is not a part of the requirements of this NFPA document but is included for informational purposes only.

J.1 The following sample ordinance is provided to assist a jurisdiction in the adoption of this code and is not part of this code.

ORDINANCE NO.

An ordinance of the /jurisdiction/adopting the 2011 edition of NFPA 58, Liquefied Petroleum Gas Code, documents listed in Chapter 2 of that code; prescribing regulations governing conditions hazardous to life and property from fire or explo-sion: providing for the issuance of permits and collection of fees; repealing Ordinance No. _____ of the [jurisdiction] and all other ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict therewith; providing a penalty; providing a severability clause; and providing for publication; and providing an effective date,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE [governing body] OF THE [jurisdiction l:

SECTION 1 That the Liquefied Petroleum Gas Code and documents adopted by Chapter 2, three (3) copies of which are on file and are open to inspection by the public in the office of the *[jurisdiction]s kreper of neords]* of the *[jurisdiction]*, are hereby adopted and incorporated into this ordinance as fully as if set out at length herein, and from the date on which this ordinance shall take effect, the provisions thereof shall be controlling within the limits of the Hurisdiction!. The same are

hereby adopted as the code of the [jurisdiction] for the purpose of prescribing regulations governing conditions hazardous to life and property from fire or explosion and providing for issuance of permits and collection of fees.

SECTION 2 Any person who shall violate any provision of this code or standard hereby adopted or fail to comply therewith; or who shall violate or fail to comply with any order made thereunder; or who shall build in violation of any detailed statement of specifications or plans submitted and approved thereunder; or falled to operate in accordance with any certificate or permit issued thereunder; and from which no appeal has been taken; or who shall fail to comply with such an order as affirmed or modified by or by a court of competent jurisdiction, within the time fixed herein, shall severally for each and every such violation and noncompliance, respectively, be guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of not less than \$ nor more than \$____ or by imprisonment for not less __ days nor more than ___ ___ days or by both such fine and imprisonment. The imposition of one penalty for any violation shall not excuse the violation or permit it to contimue; and all such persons shall be required to correct or remedy such violations or defects within a reasonable time; and when not otherwise specified the application of the above penalty shall not be held to prevent the enforced removal of prohibited conditions. Each day that prohibited conditions are maintained shall constitute a separate offense.
