JOINT MOTION TO DISMISS

Respondent, Indiana Department of Homeland Security, by counsel, and Petitioners, the Board of Commissioners of the County of Elkhart and the Elkhart County Sheriff, respectfully request that the above-captioned matter be dismissed. In support, they state:

- 1. On November 4, 2016, Respondent issued an inspection report order regarding a building identified by identification number BU26699 and named in the inspection report order as Elkhart County Courthouse. On November 23, 2016, Respondent issued an inspection report order regarding a building identified by identification number BU26786 and named in the inspection report order as Elkhart Superior Court House. These two buildings are referred to herein collectively as the "buildings." These inspection report orders regarded delays built into the buildings' egress doors (the "egress doors").
- 2. Petitioners thereafter engaged in variance proceedings with Respondent. Those proceedings did not result in issuance of a variance.
- 3. On March 23, 2017, Respondent issued new inspection report orders regarding the buildings, again regarding delays built into the buildings' egress doors.
- 4. On April 5, 2017, Petitioners filed petitions for review and for stay of effectiveness of the March 23, 2017 inspection report orders. Petitioners' filings were consolidated into the above-captioned matter.

- 5. On April 20, 2017, Respondent issued a new inspection report order for facility
- BU26699. Respondent, by counsel, thereafter indicated to Petitioners, by counsel, that the

April 20, 2017 inspection report order was issued inadvertently and that Petitioners could

disregard it.

6. Since the dates of the above-referenced inspection report orders, Petitioners have

deactivated delays built into the buildings' egress doors. Alarms built into the buildings' egress

doors continue to remain activated.

7. On November 21, 2017, and November 22, 2017, Respondent re-inspected the

buildings and determined that the buildings are in compliance with applicable fire and building

safety laws. Per this determination, all inspection report orders regarding the buildings have been

satisfied.

8. Respondent is not seeking fines against Petitioners; closure of the buildings;

referral to the Indiana Attorney General's Office for pursuit of legal action against Petitioners; or

any other penalties, judgments, or claims against Petitioners.

9. Respondent and Petitioners desire that this matter be dismissed.

WHEREFORE, Respondent and Petitioners respectfully request this matter be dismissed.
