AGREED ORDER AND STIPULATION OF DISMISSAL

The parties respectfully request the petition for review of this action be dismissed. In support of this request, the parties state the following:

- 1. On July 28, 2020, Respondent performed an inspection of Petitioner's device and issued a report of inspection, in relevant part, finding that the device was regulated by the Indiana Boiler and Pressure Vessel Rules and was required to be constructed in accordance with code.
- 2. On September 14, 2020, Respondent issued an order requiring compliance with the report of inspection.
 - 3. On September 29, 2020, Petitioner filed their petition for review of the order.
- 4. Following the initiation of this proceeding, the parties were able to informally resolve this case and agreed to the following:

For purposes of falling outside of regulation of the Indiana Boiler or Pressure Vessel Rules, Petitioner will modify the device in question to reduce its heat input to not exceed two hundred thousand (200,000) Btu per hour (or 57 kW) by February 28, 2021 or will cease operation of the device.

WHEREFORE, the parties respectfully request this matter be dismissed with prejudice.
