	I have two disagreements with this order. Violation 02 and 04.

Violation 02 Exceptions Section point 2. Conveyor type pizza ovens not used to cook "raw fatty proteins" We do not use our conveyor type pizza oven to cook raw meats of any kind. We do use it to heat pizzas and precooked meats. The use of our oven in this was has been discussed with our local Fire Marshall during several inspections in the years since the business acquired it. The Fry Daddy appliance has been removed, however, that was also present during the inspections and we were instructed to get a Fire extinguisher for grease fires.

What is the basis of your challenge?:

Violation 04-On our Construction Design Release State Form 41191 We were determined to be Occupancy classification A-3, REM. Addendum 4G0618E Specifically notes "This addendum is for a storage area for removed bowling equipment. "Fire Suppression Sprinkler is no longer required. "The Group A-3 Occupancy group designation for this building is accurately determined and fits exactly in the description for Group A-3 in Chapter 303.4 as "Assembly uses intended for worship, recreation or amusement and other assembly uses not classified elsewhere in Group A including, but not limited to: Bowling alleys, amusement arcades (pool tables and dart boards), pool and billiard parlors, etc." We offer bowling, Darts and Cornhole. We hope to offer Pool in the near future.

The primary intent of the use of our building is for Recreation.

What is your desired outcome?:

I would like Violation 02 & 04 to be removed. I believe that they are both wrongfully applied. If Violation 02 cannot be removed, I would like the remedy to be restated to allow us to continue using our conveyor type pizza oven to be used for cooking pizzas without the requirement for a hood.

Clearly we are a recreational facility and correctly classified as A-3. The project would not have gone forward with the sprinkler requirement as it would be too overly burdensome and not financially viable for the business. Both together and separately, these requirements will cause the financial failure and closing of The Brown Bowl.

I have attached our approved floor plan, design release and an email from our architect to Inspector Whitesel, laying out in detail our issue with Violation 04. I have instructed my staff to begin remediation of Violations 1,3 & 5. The requirements to remedy Violation 02 & 04 in the manner specified by Inspector Whitesel would put us out of business. We are aware of our occupancy limit of 296 people under the approved plan and have not exceeded that limit at any time. The Brown Bowl has had an Entertainment Permit for many years. We have a printed copy signed 1/06/2010. I believe that my father needed to get the permit when he added the Lights and Speaker System for Rock N Bowl. The renovations we made were intended to allow us to offer additional recreational

information in support of my request:

options for our market. In the last 3 years, Bowling has represented 66.25% of our income. We are a recreational facility both in the past and in the future. Like other businesses we have tried to add additional revenue sources to the extent that they make financial sense, however, the ability to adapt and grow as the market and economy change is vital.

We continue to work with our vendor to get pool tables into the building. Our vendor is working through the death of his business partner and has been delayed in getting the tables to our location. In a recent email they expect to be able to fix this situation in the next several weeks.

I have also attached my communication with the pool table vendor the delay in putting pool tables in the building was caused by them.



Inspector Whitesel,

My name is Bruce Everetts. I am the architect for the Brown Bowl in Portland, IN and have just been made aware of your Inspection Report dated today, 08-20-19. I would like to discuss with you your Violation number 04. (Other items on your report shall be addressed by the owner.)

In October of 2018 I generated design drawings and submitted to the Department of Homeland Security the project that renovated a portion of the Brown Bowl building that converted a portion of the bowling alley to a game room with pool tables and dart boards and including a small band performance area. Working with Indiana Code Review Official Edward Henn, he agreed that the building would maintain the appropriate A-3 Occupancy Group designation. We also worked together to ensure that the occupant load assigned to each of the areas of the building were accurate in terms of area and occupant load factor. The approved floor plan is attached for your review. You can see on that plan that the occupant load is 296, which is under the 300 limit that would require the sprinkler system. Working closely with the Code Review Official to ensure proper designations of Occupancy Group, and Occupant load, we received our Construction Design Release which I have attached for your review. The Release from the Department of Homeland Security clearly states that a sprinkler system is not required.

The Group A-3 Occupancy group designation for this building is accurately determined and fits exactly in the description for Group A-3 in Chapter 303.4 as "Assembly uses intended for worship, recreation or amusement and other assembly uses not classified elsewhere in Group A including, but not limited to: Bowling alleys, amusement arcades (pool tables and dart boards), pool and billiard parlors, etc." Clearly the use of this building is exactly as specified in this description. The A-2 Classification designated in Chapter 303.3 is for "Assembly uses intended for food and/or drink consumption including but not limited to: Banquet halls, casinos, nightclubs, restaurants, bars, etc." The focus of A-2 is on food and drink consumption. The focus for A-3 is recreation. Clearly this is a recreational facility.

I am requesting that item 04 be removed from your report. Please feel free to discuss this with me in more detail by phone if needed. We will provide any information you need.
