## CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

Meeting called to order at 10:01am by Chairman Lee Turpen. Mrs. Candice Pope called roll and announced quorum. Everyone stood for the Pledge of Allegiance.

## ADOPTION OF MINUTES

- a. Adoption of minutes from the May 17, 2018 session.

**A motion was made by Commissioner Mackey to approve the minutes as written. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Zartman. The motion passed.**

## INDIANA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH

Mrs. Katie Hokanson reported that the Stroke Center list is now on the Health Department's website. There will be a letter that will go out to all EMS Medical Directors, Hospital CEO's, and Emergency Department Managers to notify them of the list. If you do not see your hospital on the list and it should be let Mrs. Hokanson know so that your hospital can be added. The Public Health/ Public safety Opiate Conference will be August 14 at 502 East in Carmel registration is now opened if you are interested in attending. Memorial Hospital and Health Center in Jasper has received their verification for Level III Adult Trauma Center so they will not have a one year review. Elkhart General is in the ASC in verification process for Level III so they will have a one year review. The Health Department will be at the Indiana State Fair on August 13<sup>th</sup>. As of July 1 Firework injuries are no longer required to be reported to the Health Department. They have found the paper form and mailed or faxed to them that the data is incomplete. The Health Department will be paying for toxicology reports that are from suspected overdose deaths.

## EMS FOR CHILDREN

Ms. Margo Knepfkamp reported the annual breakfast for Hero's was held on May 23<sup>rd</sup>. Recipients were honored for the help in improving pediatric care. Ms. Knepfkamp thanked all of the participants in the survey that was recently completed. Reported that there is going to be a quarterly Pediatric Care Coordinator newsletter.

## INDIANA EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES ASSOCIATION (IEMSA)

Mr. Metz reported that IEMSA had a meeting with an organization called BARE. They deal mainly with allergic reactions. This group as developed an education for individuals on signs and symptoms of allergic reactions for pediatric patients. The education would be free of charge to the Indiana EMS Community. IEMSA held elections at their last meeting. Mr. Metz stated that they met with FSSA regarding the Southeast Trans. They had a face to face meeting in June and hope to have another soon to try to help with issues with the roll out and the agreements that have to be signed in order to participate in the program. A long discussion followed regarding Southeast Trans and issues that providers are encountering. Mr. Metz reported that the IEMSA conference is coming up.

Meredith Addison spoke about her health career and the need to get more people involved in the EMS field.

## INDIANA FIRE CHIEFS ASSOCIATION

Mr. Douglas Randall the co – chair of the EMS Section welcomed Director Garvey back from his leave of absence. Mr. Randall thank Ms. Robin Stump for participating in their conference call. Mr. Randall is going to invite other groups like the EMS Education working group involved in the conference calls so that everyone is on the same page. Mr. Randall reported that they are still working on the patient safety boot camp. Mr. Randall stated that on Sept. 12<sup>th</sup> there will be a web conference. Once he gets the link he will send it out. Mr. Randall talked about registration is now opened for the

IERC. They are still looking for some doctors to speak on Saturday of the conference. Nominations are being taken for the awards presented at the IERC. Mr. Randall stated the Fire Chiefs Association has an ask of the Commission. Can we make the reporting of body fluid expose the same for all disciplines?

### **EMS EDUCATION WORKING GROUP**

Mr. Jeff Quinn reported the group met on June 13<sup>th</sup>. There are 410 of the PI certified in Indiana that participated in the last meeting. A lot of new faces at the last meeting. The group discussed the minimum requirement for ambulance hours for EMT classes and decided to leave it at the minimum of 8 hours. The group discussed the new mentor program for Training Institutions. The group recommended that a mentor be assigned to all new Training Institutions as soon as they are certified. The group recommends LEMAR for test prep for the EMT National Registry exam. The POST program has been updated and will be available on Acadis. The group reviewed the EMT practical exam sheets. They are not quite ready to give recommendations to the Commission at this meeting. Updates will be coming soon to their web site. The next meeting will be at Lawrence Township on August 22, 2018 then the following meeting will be at IERC on September 12<sup>th</sup>. Asked the Commission to add the Hospital groups into the body fluid exposure reporting as well.

### **PERSONNEL WAIVER REQUESTS**

The following is requesting a waiver of 836 IAC 4-5-2 Certification and recertification; general Sec. 2. (a) Application for certification will be made on forms and according to procedures prescribed by the agency. In order to be certified as an emergency medical services primary instructor, the applicant shall meet one (1) of the following requirements: (1) Successfully complete a commission-approved Indiana emergency medical services primary instructor training course and complete all of the following: (A) Successfully complete the primary instructor written examination. (B) Successfully complete the primary instructor training program. (C) Be currently certified as an Indiana emergency medical technician. (D) Successfully pass the Indiana basic emergency medical services written and practical skills examinations within one (1) year prior to applying for certification as a primary instructor. (2) Successfully complete a training course equivalent to the material contained in the Indiana emergency medical service primary instructor course and complete all of the following: (A) successfully complete the primary instructor written examination. (B) Successfully complete the primary instructor training program. (C) Be currently certified as an Indiana emergency medical technician. (D) Successfully pass the Indiana basic emergency medical services written and practical skills examinations within one (1) year prior to applying for certification as a primary instructor. ## **PROVIDER WAIVER REQUESTS**

The following is requesting a waiver of Rule 2: General Requirements for paramedic provider organizations 836 IAC 2-2-1 (g) (1) (g) Each paramedic provider organization shall do the following: (1) Maintain an adequate number of trained personnel and emergency response vehicles to provide continuous, twenty-four (24) hour advanced life support services. (2) Notify the commission in writing within thirty (30) days of assigning any individual to perform the duties and responsibilities required of a paramedic. Eaton EMTs are requesting a waiver of the 24/7 rule to give them time to become fully staffed with paramedics as they transition from a BLS service to an ALS service. Staff recommends: approve for 6 months then reevaluate their situation. This waiver was originally granted at the March 2018 meeting.

**A motion was made by Commissioner Zartman to approve the waiver. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Mackey. The motion was approved.**

The following is requesting a waiver of (h) A paramedic ambulance service provider organization must be able to provide a paramedic level response. For the purpose of this subsection, "paramedic response" consists of the following: (1) A paramedic. (2) An emergency medical technician or higher. (3) An ambulance in compliance with the requirements of section 3(e) of this rule. (4) During transport of the patient, the following are the minimum staffing requirements: (A) If paramedic level advanced life support treatment techniques have been initiated or are needed: (i) the ambulance must be staffed by at least a paramedic and an emergency medical technician; and (ii) a paramedic shall be in the patient compartment. Fayette County EMS is asking for a waiver for whenever they are short staffed. They would like that if their ambulance is needed and they don't have a EMT to respond with the paramedic to allow a firefighter. Staff recommends: approve for a period of 1 year with 6 month reporting.

The following requested a waiver (h) A paramedic ambulance service provider organization must be able to provide a paramedic level response. For the purpose of this subsection, "paramedic response" consists of the following: (1) A paramedic. (2) An emergency medical technician or higher. (3) An ambulance in compliance with the requirements of section 3(e) of this rule. (4) During transport of the patient, the following are the minimum staffing requirements: (A) If paramedic level advanced life support treatment techniques have been initiated or are needed: (i) the ambulance must be staffed by at least a paramedic and an emergency medical technician; and (ii) a paramedic shall be in the patient compartment. Knox County EMS is asking for a waiver for whenever they are short staffed. They would like that if their ambulance is needed and they don't have a EMT to respond with the paramedic to allow a firefighter. Staff recommends: denial

**Mr. Kinney spoke about the waiver and the reasoning behind the staff recommendation for denial. A lot of discussion followed. After discussion the motion was made by Commissioner Hoggatt to approve a temporary waiver until the September 12<sup>th</sup> Commission meeting and wants the following information to be brought back to the Commission to make a final decision on the waiver request: KCEMS will provide the following additional data to IDHS by the end of business on September 5, 2018, for the period of July 20, 2018, through August 31, 2018:**

- Total number of responses
- Total number of transports
- Total number of ALS transports
- Total number of ALS responses handled by a BLS crew (no paramedic available)
- A log of the ALS transports where a paramedic transports an ALS patient without an EMT on board,

said log to include:

- Date and time of transport
- Run Number of transport
- Type of call
- Notation whether this was a primary or back-up unit
- Notation whether this was a scheduled or call-in unit
- Notation as to what other units were on duty at that time and their status
- Information on whether mutual aid or roll-over to another service was considered or done for each waiver usage. If mutual aid or roll-over was considered but not utilized, an explanation why it was not utilized (such as distance, etc.).
- Data on how many roll-over calls (calls that were dispatched to Knox County EMS but declined by KCEMS and handled by another EMS ambulance provider) are sent to a mutual aid provider or to a private ambulance provider within Knox County.
- Detailed analysis on the hiring practices and human resources of KCEMS include
  - Current staff roster with certification levels
  - Position types within KCEMS (examples are driver only, EMR, EMT, paramedic) and their job credentials for each
  - Explanation of the staffing situation of KCEMS, what has been done to recruit staff and a plan of action to minimize the usage of a waiver if granted for a longer period.

As well as IDHS staff facilitate a meeting with Knox County, the county Commissioners and dispatch to help resolve the issue.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Bowman. Commissioner Mackey abstained from the vote. The motion was approved.

The following is requesting a waiver of (h) A paramedic ambulance service provider organization must be able to provide a paramedic level response. For the purpose of this subsection, "paramedic response" consists of the following: (1) A paramedic. (2) An emergency medical technician or higher. (3) An ambulance in compliance with the requirements of section 3(e) of this rule. (4) During transport of the patient, the following are the minimum staffing requirements: (A) If paramedic level advanced life support treatment techniques have been initiated or are needed: (i) the ambulance must be staffed by at least a paramedic and an emergency medical technician; and (ii) a paramedic shall be in the patient compartment. Rushville City FD is asking for a waiver for whenever they are short staffed. They would like that if their ambulance is needed and they don't have a EMT to respond with the paramedic to allow a firefighter. Staff recommends: approve for a period of 1 year with 6 month reporting.

Rushville City FD

A motion was made by Commissioner Zartman to approve staff recommendation. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Ryan. The motion passed.

The following is requesting a waiver of (h) A paramedic ambulance service provider organization must be able to provide a paramedic level response. For the purpose of this subsection, "paramedic response" consists of the following: (1) A paramedic. (2) An emergency medical technician or higher. (3) An ambulance in compliance with the requirements of section 3(e) of this rule. (4) During transport of the patient, the following are the minimum staffing requirements: (A) If paramedic level advanced life support treatment techniques have been initiated or are needed: (i) the ambulance must be staffed by at least a paramedic and an emergency medical technician; and (ii) a paramedic shall be in the patient compartment. Southwest Ambulance is asking for a waiver for whenever they are short staffed for their 3<sup>rd</sup> ambulance out or during an MCI event. They

would like that if their ambulance is needed and they don't have an EMT to respond with the paramedic to allow a driver. Staff recommends: approve for a period of 2 year with 6 month reporting.

#### Southwest Ambulance Service

**A motion was made by Commissioner Mackey to approve staff recommendation. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Ryan. The motion was modified to be for one year instead of two years. The motion was approved.**

**Chairman Turpen directed that staff work on a non-rule policy concerning staffing requirements for ALS trucks for the September meeting.**

Chairman Turpen called for a break at 12:10 pm

Chairman Turpen called the meeting back to order at 12:22pm

Mrs. Lindi Holt introduced her Paramedic students for recognition.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

- a. Epi Training - Dr. Kaufmann presented the Epi Training to the Commission members and the suggested protocol.

**A motion was made by Commissioner Mackey to approve the training and the suggested protocol. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Hoggatt. The motion was approved.**

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

- a. Signed Policies for Administrative Orders and Investigations – Mr. Kraig Kinney reported to the Commission that the policies that were presented at the last meeting have been signed by Fire Marshal Greeson. A copy of the policies were provided for the Commission members to review.
  - No action needed. None taken.
- b. Tables Business and/or waivers
  - a. Veronica Hensley waiver – Mrs. Pope asked that is waiver be table for one more meeting to give Ms. Hensley time to finish her medical treatments so there would be more information for the Commission.

#### **2017 – LEGISLATIVE IMPLEMENTATION**

Mr. Kinney reported that Suicide prevention the course is basically done and should be ready to roll out soon. Stroke protocol was filed on July 18<sup>th</sup> and waiting on approval to move forward. Air Ambulance guidelines have been approved with one correction is completed. The field Trauma and transport rule is expiring and needs to be readopted. The updates will be in the rule rewrite.

**A motion was made by Commissioner Mackey to readopt the current rule to keep it in the rules. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Bowman. The motion was approved.**

Mr. Kinney reported that two things are in the works for 2018. The POST has been updated and the Epi training was adopted earlier in the meeting so the Commission is already in compliance with the 2018 legislative updates.

IC 16-31-3-14 Disciplinary sanctions; denial, suspension, or revocation; appeals; investigations; reinstatement; consistency of sanctions

Sec. 14. (a) A person holding a certificate or license issued under this article must comply with the applicable standards and rules established under this article. A certificate holder or license holder is subject to disciplinary sanctions under subsection (b) if the department of homeland security determines that the certificate holder or license holder:

(7) fails to comply and maintain compliance with or violates any applicable provision, standard, or other requirement of this article or rules adopted under this article;

836 IAC 1-1-5 (b) Requires providers to submit data by the fifteenth of the following month.

836 IAC 1-1-5 Reports and records

Authority: IC 16-31-2-7; IC 16-31-3 Affected: IC 4-21.5; IC 16-31-3

Sec. 5. (a) All emergency medical service provider organizations shall comply with this section.

(b) All emergency medical service provider organizations shall participate in the emergency medical service system review by collecting and reporting data elements. The elements shall be submitted to the agency by the fifteenth of the following month by electronic format or submitted on disk in the format and manner specified by the commission. The data elements prescribed by the commission are the following National Emergency Medical Service Information System (NEMSIS), created by the National Association of EMS Directors in partnership with the federal National Highway Traffic Safety Administration data elements:

(The draft rule change for data collection has been submitted to start the promulgation process that will require the 225 data elements and that the data is to be submitted within 24 hours of a completed run)

IC 16-31-3-14 (b)(5) Give the Commission options of sanctions:

(b) The department of homeland security may issue an order under IC 4-21.5-3-6 to impose one (1) or more of the following sanctions if the department of homeland security determines that a certificate holder or license holder is subject to disciplinary sanctions under subsection (a):

- (1) Revocation of a certificate holder's certificate or license holder's license for a period not to exceed seven (7) years.
- (2) Suspension of a certificate holder's certificate or license holder's license for a period not to exceed seven (7) years.
- (3) Censure of a certificate holder or license holder.
- (4) Issuance of a letter of reprimand.
- (5) Assessment of a civil penalty against the certificate holder or license holder in accordance with the following:
  - (A) The civil penalty may not exceed five hundred dollars (\$500) per day per violation.

(B) If the certificate holder or license holder fails to pay the civil penalty within the time specified by the department of homeland security, the department of homeland security may suspend the certificate holder's certificate or license holder's license without additional proceedings.

(6) Placement of a certificate holder or license holder on probation status and requirement of the certificate holder or license holder to:

(A) report regularly to the department of homeland security upon the matters that are the basis of probation;

(B) limit practice to those areas prescribed by the department of homeland security;

(C) continue or renew professional education approved by the department of homeland security until a satisfactory degree of skill has been attained in those areas that are the basis of the probation; or

(D) perform or refrain from performing any acts, including community restitution or service without compensation, that the department of homeland security considers appropriate to the public interest or to the rehabilitation or treatment of the certificate holder or license holder. The department of homeland security may withdraw or modify this probation if the department of homeland security finds after a hearing that the deficiency that required disciplinary action is remedied or that changed circumstances warrant a modification of the order

#### Proposal

The EMS Staff is proposing to allow providers on this list to become complaint by October 1, 2018.

On November 15, 2018, which would be the next date per the rules that providers would be required to submit data, those providers still not complaint would be sanctioned the \$500 for the one occurrence of not submitting the data by the 15th of the following month and each month thereafter until the provider becomes complaint. Upon Commission decision the EMS Staff will send letters by the end of July 2018 to each of the provider organizations on this list of being non-compliant stating the Commission decision with final dates and options for reporting.

**Staff asked that the Commission give staff discretion to hold the \$500 fine if a service is in the process of becoming compliant.**

**A motion was made by Commissioner Mackey to accept staff recommendation and grant staff discretion to hold the \$500 fine if a service is in the process of becoming compliant. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Bowman. Chairman Turpen, Commissioner Lardaro, and Commissioner Hoggatt abstained from the vote. The motion passed.**

Dr. Kaufmann thanked Demetrius for his work as a summer intern to help develop the reports being presented.



## EMS Training Report to Indiana EMS Commission July 19, 2018

Since the May EMS Commission meeting we pushed out recommendations from those EMT programs whose students are passing the NREMT at the acceptable level as established by the Commission. We have also assigned six (6) coaches so far to those programs whose students are not passing at the 70% benchmark as established by the Commission. In addition, in order to be proactive we are assigning a coach to any new program to get them off on the right foot.

1. We are continuing to work with the leadership of the Primary Instructor's Working Group to share proven educational practices.
2. In conjunction with the Indiana Primary Instructor Working Group, hold a PI workshop for the sole purpose of helping instructors raise their student's certification exam scores. This will take place at the IERC in September.
3. I contacted the individual from the Indiana Department of Education as requested that he ask the high schools and career center to emphasize to the principals and guidance counselors that EMT class is not easy and consists of college level material and students should be placed in the program accordingly.
