## Results from SLRP Workgroup Funding Strategy Discussion Meeting on 2/19/18

## Document Summary:

This document summarizes the information collected from workgroup members during the February 19<sup>th</sup> SLRP Workgroup meeting. At the conclusion of the meeting, workgroup members indicated their responses to the feasibility of each financing model using three sticker options: blue stickers represented a response of "positive," yellow stickers represented a response of "neutral," and red stickers represented a response of "negative." 


