

Frequently Asked Questions

Why is there a need for participant titration?

 Titration prepares participants for paying their recovery residence housing without assistance. Utilizing titration allows the participant to slowly ease into self-pay, without having the burden of full housing costs all at once.

• When should titration happen?

 All participants must begin titration in month four of treatment.
 Please see the titration schedule under the Resource tab available on the Recovery Works website.

• Is titration a new Recovery Works practice?

- Titration has always been a part of the Recovery Works model.
 Recovery Works is seeking to bring more awareness to titration and guide providers on how to successfully implement a titration system.
- Are all providers required to utilize the Recovery Works Titration System?
 - All providers are required to utilize the stated Recovery Works titration system.
- What should agencies do if a participant has been receiving treatment/recovery residence four over four (4) months and titration has not started?
 - A titration plan should be developed with the participant immediately (effective 1/1/2024) and the participant should begin titrating down according to the schedule titration schedule.
- What is an example of a titration schedule?
 - **Month 1** RW Full payment

Month 2 – RW Full payment

Month 3 – RW Full payment

Month 4 – Participant pays 1 week/RW pays 3

Month 5 – Participant pays 1 week/RW pays 3

Month 6 – Participant pays 2 weeks/RW pays 2



Month 7 – Participant pays 2 wees/RW pays 2

Month 8 – Participant pays 3 weeks/RW pays 1

Month 9 – Participant pays 3 weeks/RW pays 1

Month 10 – Participant pays full stay

Month 11– Participant pays full stay

Month 12 – Participant pays full stay
