BUSINESS MEETING**

September 17, 2015
Indiana Government Center South
Indianapolis, Indiana

Call to Order and Roll Call:

Chairman Cris Johnston called the meeting to order at 2:00 p.m. local time. A quorum was present.

Approval of the Minutes:

Upon motion by Joseph Svetanoff, second by Anita Sherman, and unanimous vote of those present, the Commission approved the proposed minutes from the June 18, 2015, Business Meeting.

Report of the Executive Director:

The Executive Director began her report with the introduction of five new employees. In the Legal Division, Greg Small, was announced as the new General Counsel. Shadi Lilly is the new Executive Administrator and Natalie River is our newest staff attorney. Also introduced was the new Director of Gaming Control, Rob Townsend, and Anthony Calvert, our newest Background Investigator for the Indianapolis office.

Executive Director Tait announced that the Background and Financial Investigation Division completed their reinvestigations of Pinnacle Entertainment and Blue Chip. The confidential reports were previously submitted to the Commissioners, and Directors Brown and Leek were present at the meeting to answer any questions about the reports.

Waiver of Rules and Regulations:

Casino Association: Members were granted relief from the requirement of the check cashing aggregate prior to establishing check cashing privileges. Commission granted an

increase to the aggregate amount of checks cashed utilizing a check guarantee service to \$20,000.

They were also granted a waiver to allow a second slot attendant the ability to verify, escort and view the reset for manually paid jackpots of \$5,000 and below.

Ameristar: Allowed an addition of a \$25,000 primary chip denomination. \$25,000 primary chip will be canary yellow in color and the secondary chip will be Daisy colored.

Belterra: Allowed to perform a coin test on one machine per bank of machines in the seven games in lieu of testing all machines during an upgrade to their system. One time waiver only.

French Lick: Granted relief from the maintenance of found cash equivalents valued at \$5 or less. Casino will no longer have to track or record found money to tickets or chips under \$5. However, the funds will still need to be included in the drop. This waiver does not include Tito tickets found in slot machines. Cash equivalents over \$5 will continue to be maintained according to rules. French Lick is granted a relief the requirements to install two locks on compartment door where a progressive controller is stored. The casino only asked for a relief of this requirement on storage compartments that cannot accommodate a second lock. The key to a single lock will be given to the Commission's Executive Director or his or her designee.

Horseshoe Southern Indiana: Withdrew a waiver granted on April 28, 2008, that allowed the additional \$25,000 value chip which was rectangular in shape. The casino will still utilize the \$25,000 chip, but it will be round in shape as required by the rules.

Executive Director Tait reported that IGC staff added 32 individuals to the Exclusion List since the June Commission Meeting, which barred those patrons from entering any casino in Indiana. Of those individuals, four were placed on the exclusion list for post posting, pinching or capping bets. Twenty-five were placed on the list for taking illegal possession of a TITO, casino chips, or U.S. Currency in excess of approximately \$500, providing fraudulent information while attempting to claim a jackpot, or making fraudulent cash withdrawals while at an Indiana casino. One individual, a former slot technician, was placed on the exclusion list for using his position to fraudulently obtain and redeem TITO tickets while a second individual, a former beverage server, was placed on the list for using his position to obtain money from the cage, which he later removed from the casino. All of these employees were terminated from their positions.

A settlement agreement was reached with Belterra Casino wherein the casino did not follow the rules regarding playing cards. Belterra has agreed to a monetary settlement of \$1,500 in lieu of disciplinary action.

A settlement agreement was reached with Blue Chip Casino which involves three counts: Ct. 1 violated the rule regarding the securing of playing cards not utilized on a live table game; Ct. 2 involved an underage non-gaming employee who was allowed on the casino floor, and in Ct 3. The casino failed to timely submit paperwork for a terminated employee. Blue Chip has agreed to a monetary settlement of \$4,000 in lieu of disciplinary action.

A settlement agreement was reached with Hollywood Casino involving two counts. Ct. 1: violation of rules regarding the licensing and badging of occupational licensees. Ct. 2 involves the casino allowing an employee to work for two years in a position requiring a level 2 license, without having applied for the license. Hoosier Park has agreed to a monetary settlement of \$9,000 in lieu of disciplinary action.

A settlement agreement was reached with Indiana Grand regarding two counts. The first count involved the violation of the rules regarding the soft count process and reconciliation of the count, resulting in unsecured funds on the casino floor. Ct. 2 involved the violation of VEP rules. Indiana Grand has agreed to a monetary settlement of \$7,000 in lieu of disciplinary action.

A settlement agreement was reached with Majestic Star regarding five counts. The first count involved the casino failing to follow their internal controls for issuing paid outs. Ct. 2 The casino violated the playing card rule on five different occasions. In Ct. 3, the casino allowed an employee to work with an expired license. Ct. 4 violated the rule regarding the bill validator box drop and count procedures on three separate occasions. Ct. 5, the casino failed to follow the rules for the table game process. Majestic Star has agreed to a monetary settlement of \$30,500 in lieu of disciplinary action.

A settlement agreement was reached with Tropicana Evansville regarding four counts. The first count involved the casino receiving machines from a sister property which contained software not approved in Indiana. Ct. 2 Machines received from a sister property were shipped with EPROMs inside the machines and not separately as required. Ct. 3 violated the rule regarding playing cards on two separate occasions. Ct. 4 violated the rule regarding camera coverage of the route, both inside and outside the casino, through which monies are transported. Tropicana has agreed to a monetary settlement of \$14,000 in lieu of disciplinary action

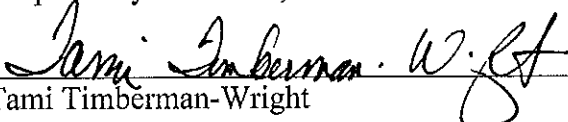

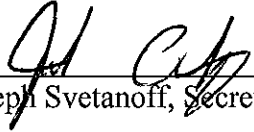
