RESOLUTION 2000-19

A RESOLUTION CONCERNING THE REQUEST OF PROGRESSIVE GAMES, INC. TO WITHDRAW ITS APPLICATION FOR A SUPPLIER'S LICENSE

The Indiana Gaming Commission ("Commission") adopts the following resolution pursuant to the authority granted to it under IC 4-33 and pursuant to 68 IAC 1-2-6.

The Commission has considered the following factors:

- 1. On or about November 17, 1995, Progressive Games, Inc. ("PGI") was issued a temporary supplier's license.
- 2. On September 2, 1998, PGI became a wholly owned subsidiary of Mikohn Gaming Corporation ("Mikohn"). PGI requests leave to withdraw its application for a supplier's license pursuant to 68 IAC 2-2-4(d).
- 3. On or about February 22, 2000, the Commission received a written request from Charles H. McCrea, Jr., Executive Vice President and General Counsel of Mikohn requesting leave to withdraw PGI's application for a supplier's license (copy of letter attached).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE INDIANA GAMING COMMISSION THAT THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION IS ADOPTED:

SECTION 1. SCOPE.

This resolution applies to PGI.

SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS.

The definitions set forth in IC 4-33-2 and 68 IAC apply to this resolution.

SECTION 3. REQUEST TO WITHDRAW.

The request of PGI for leave to withdraw its application for a supplier's license, received on February 22, 2000 is hereby:
