

RESOLUTION 2001-12

A RESOLUTION APPROVING FOR PROPOSED READOPTION ARTICLES 1, 2, 6, 7, 8, AND 9 OF TITLE 68 OF THE INDIANA ADMINISTRATIVE CODE

The Indiana Gaming Commission ("Commission") adopts the following resolution pursuant to the authority granted to it under IC 4-33 and pursuant to 68 IAC 1-2-6.

The Commission has considered the following factors:

1. Under IC 4-22-2.5, rules promulgated under IC 4-22-2 and in force December 31, 1995 expire not later than January 1, 2002.
2. The Commission has already began the readoption process for these rules pursuant to IC 4-22-2.5-4 by publishing a Notice of Intent to Readopt in the *Indiana Register* on February 1, 2001.
3. A proposed notice to readopt will be published in the *Indiana Register* on April 1, 2001, with a public hearing scheduled for May 2, 2001.
4. The promulgation process for the final promulgation of these rules will take a minimum of four (4) to six (6) months.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE INDIANA GAMING COMMISSION, THAT THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION IS ADOPTED:

SECTION 1. SCOPE.

This resolution applies to each applicant, each licensee, each riverboat license applicant, any person who does business with an applicant or licensee, and any person who is a patron of a Riverboat Gambling Operation.

SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS.

The definitions set forth in IC 4-33-2 and 68 IAC apply to this resolution.

SECTION 3. READOPTION.

The Commission proposes to readopt the following rules:

68 IAC 1 GENERAL PROVISIONS
68 IAC 2 LICENSES AND APPROVAL OF ASSOCIATED EQUIPMENT
68 IAC 6 EXCLUSION AND EVICTION OF PERSONS
68 IAC 7 DENIAL AND EXCLUSION HEARINGS
68 IAC 8 PUBLIC SAFETY AND EXCURSIONS

68 IAC 9 ETHICS

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This RESOLUTION is effective immediately.

SECTION 5. EXPIRATION DATE.

This RESOLUTION expires thirty (30) days from the date and time that the Secretary of State accepts the rules listed in Section 3 for filing.
